Pre-1066	Addington Parva is held by Azor. He also owns vast estates from Lincolnshire down to the Isle of Wight.

	Addington Parva passes to Osmund, a clergyman, subject to the overlordship of Geoffrey de Montbray Bishop of Coutances. Geoffrey is known as a soldier rather than a bishop, attending the Battle of Hastings and leading troops to suppress uprisings.		
1088	Geoffrey joins an uprising against King William II Rufus. Addington Parva probably passes to Robert Fitz Hamon, Baron of Gloucester or possibly his son a few years later.		William II 1087-1100
1120	In the Northamptonshire Survey William de Huntingdon is recorded as having a hide and 1 ½ virgates (165 acres) in Addington Parva. He owes service to the Earl of Gloucester. A subordinate lordship is held by Maurice Daundelyn.		Henry I 1100-35
Unknown	Addington Parva passes to Robert Grimbald a King's Justice.		Stephen 1135-54
1156-62	Robert is appointed High Sheriff of Cambridge and Huntingdonshire.		Henry II 1154-89
1163	Robert dies and Addington Parva passes to his widow Maud.

1558/9	Giles dies leaving a son and heir John. Addington Parva is still subject to the overlordship of the Honour of Gloucester.	Elizabeth I 1558-1603
1627	Addington Parva has passed to Richard Weekly who dies leaving a son and heir Henry. This lordship of Addington Parva is lost possibly being amalgamated into the families' other lordship in Little Addington.	James I 1603-25 Charles I 1625-49
