1086	Domesday Ralph de Belfou is recorded in the Domesday Book as the 1st Baron of Hockering . He possibly serves as a Sheriff of Norfolk.		
1122	Ralph dies leaving Hockering to his wife Agnes in dower even though he has at least three sons. She marries Hubert I de Ria who serves as 2nd Baron of Hockering in the right of his wife. Hubert has been a loyal vassal of William the Conqueror since before 1047.		William II 1087-1100 Henry I 1100-35
Before 1127	Hubert dies leaving a son and heir Henry 3rd Baron of Hockering .		
1161/2	Henry dies leaving a son and heir Hubert II 4th Baron of Hockering .		Stephen 1135-54 Henry II 1154-89
1170	Hubert dies leaving a son and heir Hubert III.		
1174	Hubert comes of age and becomes 5th Baron of Hockering .		
1188	Hubert dies leaving two daughters as co-heirs Isabel and Aline who receive a moiety (share) of the Barony, joint 6th Barons of Hockering .

1199	Isabel marries Geoffrey Chester and Aline marries John I Marshall.	Richard I 1189-99 John 1199-1216
1203	Aline moiety – John serves King John in Normandy and holds the Castle of Falaise, receiving land in Normandy and England as his reward.	
1206/7	Isabel moiety – Geoffrey dies, and Isabel marries Roger de Cressy.	Henry III 1216-72
1207	Aline moiety – John is appointed Marshal of Ireland.	
1215	<p style="text-align: center;">Magna Carta</p> Aline moiety – John is one of King John’s advisers on Magna Carta. John is appointed ambassador to the Pope.	
1215-1217	<p style="text-align: center;">First Barons War</p>	
1216	Aline moiety – John is with King John when he dies. He attends the coronation of King Henry. John’s uncle, William Marshall is appointed Regent to the young King and John is part of his ruling Council.	
1217	Aline moiety – John is appointed Keeper of Devises Castle in Wiltshire. John plays a leading role in the naval Battle of Sandwich. John is appointed Chief Justice of the Forests and custodian of the Earldom of Devon and the Isle of Wight.	
1235	Aline Moiety – John dies and the Barony reverts to Aline.	
1246	Isabel moiety – Roger dies, and the Barony reverts to Isabel.	
1263	Isabel dies leaving her sister Aline as her heir thus reuniting the Barony.	
1264-1267	<p style="text-align: center;">Second Barons War</p>	
1267	Aline dies, her son William pre-deceasing her, leaving the Barony to her grandson John II Marshall,	
1278	John reaches majority and becomes 7th Baron of Hockering .	Edward I 1272-1307
1280	Sir John is appointed Marshal of Ireland.	
1282	Sir John is summoned to do military service in Wales and dies in battle, leaving a son and heir William aged 5.

Date	History of Lordship	Monarchs
1298	William reaches majority and becomes 8th Baron of Hockering and inherits the office of Marshal of Ireland.	
1314	William dies at the Battle of Bannockburn leaving a son and heir John III 9th Baron of Hockering . John attends the Queen when she travels to Scotland.	Edward II 1307-27
1316	John dies without issue (childless) leaving two sisters Denise and Hawise (wife of Sir Robert de Morley). Denise dies shortly after leaving Hawise as her heir 10th Baron of Hockering . Robert inherits the office of Marshall of Ireland through his wife.	
1327/9	Hawise dies and Sir Robert continues as Baron.	Edward III 1327-77
1339	Sir Robert is one of the most famous naval officers of the Wars of Scottish Independence and Hundred Years War and is appointed Admiral of the Northern Fleet.	
1355	Sir Robert is appointed Constable of the Tower of London.	
1360	Sir Robert dies in Burgundy leaving a son and heir William 11th Baron of Hockering . He also inherits the office of Marshal of Ireland.	
1379	William dies leaving a son and heir Sir Thomas 12th Baron of Hockering . He also inherits the office of Marshal of Ireland.	Richard II 1377-1399
1386	It is feared England is going to be invaded so Sir Thomas is appointed as the Chief Commissioner to survey the defences of Great Yarmouth.	
1391	Sir Thomas is granted permission to go on crusade.	
1415	Sir Thomas fights with King Henry at the Battle of Agincourt.	Henry IV 1399-1413 Henry V 1413-22
1416	Sir Thomas dies in Calais leaving a son and heir also Thomas 13th Baron of Hockering . He also inherits the office of Marshal of Ireland.	
1418	Sir Thomas takes part in the siege of Rouen.	
1420	Sir Thomas takes part in the siege of Melun.	
1421/2	Sir Thomas takes part in the siege of Meaux.	Henry VI 1422-61 1470-71

1422	Sir Thomas bears one of the banners at the funeral of King Henry.	
1427/35	Sir Thomas is summoned to Parliament.	
1435	Sir Thomas dies leaving a son and heir Robert 14th Baron of Hockering . He also inherits the office of Marshal of Ireland.	
1443	Robert dies aged 23 leaving a daughter and heir Alianore, wife of Sir William Lovel who serves as 15th Baron of Hockering in the right of his wife. He also inherits the office of Marshal of Ireland.	
1455-1487	War of the Roses	Edward IV 1461-70 1471-83
1476	Alianore dies leaving a son and heir Henry 16th Baron of Hockering . He also inherits the office of Marshal of Ireland.	
1489	Henry is slain at Dixmude dying without issue (childless) leaving a sister and heir Alice (wife of Sir William Parker, former Privy Counsellor and standard bearer to King Richard) 17th Baron of Hockering .	Edward V 1483 Richard III 1483-5 Henry VII 1485-1509
1518	Alice dies leaving a son and heir Sir Henry 18th Baron of Hockering . Henry is a courtier and author/translator.	Henry VIII 1509-47
1523	Sir Henry is summoned to the House of Lords. He is sent to Germany as an ambassador to present Archduke Ferdinand with the Order of the Garter.	
1530	Sir Henry is one of the peers who signs the letter to Pope Clement VII, praying for the Pope's assent to King Henry's divorce of Catherine Arragon.	
1534	The Act of Supremacy – Church of England	
1537	Sir Henry assists in carrying Princess Elizabeth at the christening of Prince Edward.	
1547	Sir Henry attends the funeral of King Henry.	Edward VI 1547-53
1556	Sir Henry dies leaving a grandson and heir also Sir Henry 19th Baron of Hockering . He is made a Knight of the Bath at Queen Mary's coronation. He serves as Lord Lieutenant of Hertfordshire.	Mary I 1553-58

1569	Sir Henry evokes his privilege as a peer to decline to sign a declaration under the Act of Uniformity of Common Prayer as he is a devout Catholic.	Elizabeth I 1558-1603
1570	Sir Henry leaves England as he is unwilling to serve as a Protestant. He appeals to Queen Elizabeth for permission to return to England and when this fails he asks for permission for his family to join him.	
1574	Sir Henry visits King Philip II of Spain who gives him 600 ducats. He travels on to Lisbon, then to Paris. He writes to England again, claiming his only fault is that he left England without permission.	
1577	Sir Henry dies leaving a son and heir Edward 20th Baron of Hockering .	
1586	Edward is one of the peers who sat in judgement on Mary, Queen of Scots.	James I 1603-25
1618	Edward dies leaving a son and heir William 21st Baron of Hockering . He is summoned to Parliament as Baron Morley and Baron Monteagle.	
1622	William dies leaving a son and heir Henry 22nd Baron of Hockering .	
1642-1651	English Civil War	Charles I 1625-49
1655	Henry dies leaving a son and heir Thomas 23rd Baron of Hockering .	Charles II 1660-85 James II 1685-88 William III 1688-1702
1697	Thomas dies leaving the descendants of two of his aunts as co-heirs and the barony is partitioned not to be joined again.
